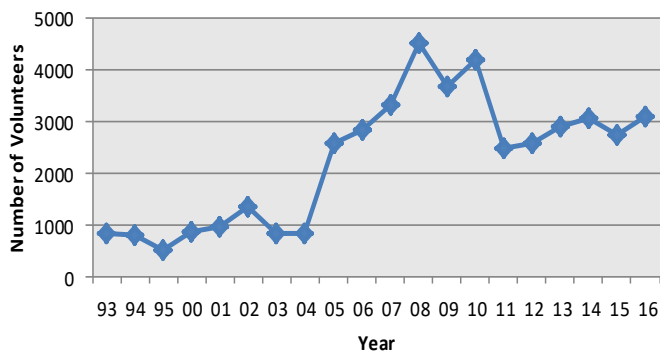

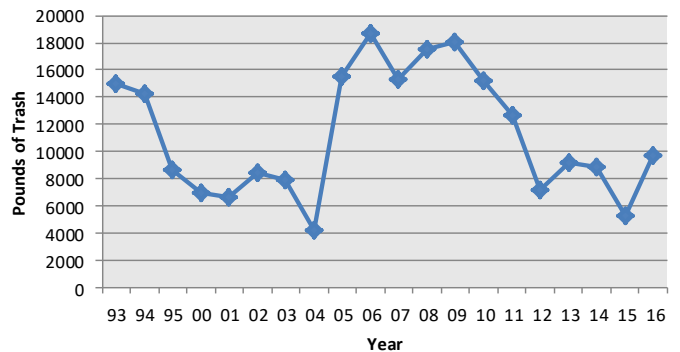

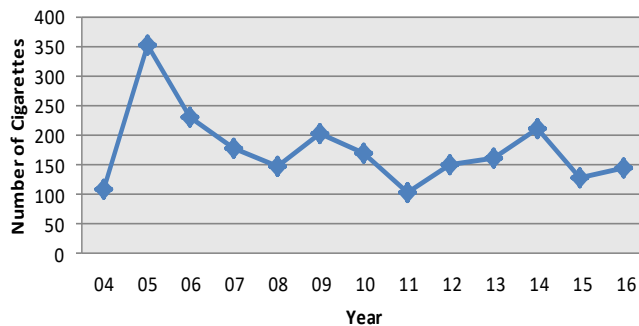
Volunteers Per Year
