We collected these items from the beach most often. Almost all of these items are made of plastic.



The weight of litter collected in 2022 is equivalent to 4.5 full-grown male moose!



Where did we clean?

Our cleanups spanned 37 coastal sites from Portland, ME to Ipswich, MA.

The most frequentlycleaned beaches were Hampton Main Beach in Hampton, NH and Foss Beach in Rye, NH.
